
#### WHAT SHOULD A LITERACY CLASSROOM LOOK LIKE?

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# WHAT DOES THAT LOOK LIKE IN A LITERACY CLASSROOM?


- "Sounds First" Approach: Early grades should have a strong focus on systematic, sequential, explicit instruction in decoding (Phonemic Awareness and Phonics) and accuracy. "Sounds First" Approach
- **2. Practice:** Students need to practice a "sounds-first" approach to building decoding and encoding skills daily.
- **3. Knowledge Building:** Classrooms should also have fluent reading models that help students build background and content knowledge.
- **4. Comprehensive Daily Lessons:** Students should see the FULL continuum of reading every day.

# WHAT DOES THAT **NOT** LOOK LIKE IN A LITERACY CLASSROOM?


- 1. Approaches that ask student to **guess**
- 2. Reliance on pictures or cues
- 3. Lessons that focus on **one part** of reading
- 4. Over prompting by teachers-lack of student-centered practice

Note: Strong materials, strong training, and strong support help teachers execute effective literacy lessons.
