Joint-operated School Establishment and Purpose

- The Region VII Virtual Academy was established as a joint-operated school to alleviate the participating school division demands of providing both remote and in-person learning opportunities. Participating school divisions believe students in these small, rural divisions can be better served by collaborating with one another in order to produce a quality virtual learning environment for students. The Region VII Virtual Academy will provide remote learning opportunities for Region VII students.

Instructional offerings:

- Virtual Virginia, Stride-K12 Virtual Schools, LLC., and Edgenuity will provide instruction to students (as determined by each participating division).
- Course offerings for each of the Multidivision Online Providers (MOP) are attached as appendices.
- Anticipated enrollment of 1500 students
- Serving students in grades K-12

Admissions and Placement Practices

- Student enrollment in Region VII Virtual Academy shall be based on referrals from the participating school divisions. Minimum number of slots will be provided to each participating school division as determined by the Board. The Board will identify admissions criteria as well as criteria for the removal of a student from the program. The final decision for all such student actions will rest with the responsible school division.

Meeting SOQ and SOA Requirements

The Region VII Virtual Academy will ensure adherence to all Standards of Accreditation and Standards of Quality requirements, as set forth by the Virginia Department of Education.

- Region VII Virtual Academy will be staffed by instructors from 1) Virtual Virginia, 2) Stride-K12 Virtual Schools, LLC., and/or 3) Edgenuity. Virtual Virginia is a program of the Virginia Department of Education and Stride-K12 Virtual Schools and Edgenuity are approved Virginia MOP and employ highly-qualified staff.
- Counseling services will be provided to students through each responsible school division.
- Required Standard of Learning assessments will be administered through each student's responsible school.
- Required services will be provided to all students, including English Learners, students with disabilities, and students who are economically disadvantaged. Responsible schools will provide meals to participating students as needed or requested.
- Remediation and student support will be provided by the MOP to any student who is not meeting academic expectations. This remediation may be in the form of personalized feedback, differentiated instruction, and small group or individual tutoring. In the event a student is not meeting criteria for continued enrollment, the option to continue in this setting will be revoked; the student will return to in-person learning provided by responsible school.

Accountability

- Region VII Virtual Academy (full-time program) students will remain the responsibility of their home-zoned school within their county/city of residence and will be served through the virtual academy.
- Student accountability measures will be associated with each student's responsible school and school division.

Student Access, Outcomes, and Achievement

- The Region VII Virtual Academy will improve student access, outcomes and achievement by providing students an opportunity to learn in a remote space. This high quality virtual environment assists in providing equity of access to diverse content that may not be available through responsible school, offers instruction differentiated on a per student basis, and increases participation and interaction with Virginia-approved curriculum.

Administration

- For the 2021-2022 school year, school administration will include an Executive Steering Committee (Advisory Council) made up of Superintendents (or their Designee from member divisions) and an Executive Director.

Timeline of Operation

- The Board was established in January of 2021 and will begin serving students beginning August of 2021.

Budget/Fiscal Administration Information

- Participating School Boards shall provide an initial payment of \$10,000 to join the Region VII Virtual Academy. This payment is non-refundable should a School Board dissolve its association with the Region VII Virtual Academy.
- Participating School Boards shall provide each fiscal year, on a per pupil basis, such funds as are necessary to establish, operate and maintain Region VII Virtual Academy as determined during the budgeting process undertaken by the Board.

- Radford City Public Schools shall serve as initial Fiscal Agent of Region VII Virtual Academy. The Fiscal Agent shall, in conjunction with the Finance Officer, handle the financial affairs of Region VII Virtual Academy as may be authorized by the Board. The Fiscal Agent shall have no direct authority over the administration or operation of Region VII Virtual Academy. A change in the Fiscal Agent shall require approval of the majority of the Board.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the School Boards of the Counties of Bland, Buchanan, Carroll, Dickenson, Giles, Grayson, Lee, Pulaski, Russell, Scott, Smyth, Tazewell, Washington, Wise, and Wythe, and the School Boards of the Cities of Bristol, Galax, Norton, and Radford (together the "School Boards"), desire to establish, operate and control a regional school to be temporarily known as Region VII Virtual Academy pursuant to Virginia Code §22.1-26 and Regulations of the Virginia Board of Education; and

WHEREAS, Region VII Virtual Academy will provide an option for students in grades Pre-Kindergarten through 12 to attend school in a virtual setting either full time, or on a course by course basis, depending on the educational needs of the student; and

WHEREAS, the School Boards believe it to be in the best interest of their respective school divisions to make use of the opportunities afforded by a regional school, and that this endeavor may be most beneficially accomplished by the operation of a jointly owned and controlled regional school; and

WHEREAS, the School Boards have jointly developed an Agreement to Establish and Operate the Region VII Virtual Academy Regional School (the "Agreement") to accomplish such purposes, in the form attached to this Resolution as Exhibit A; and

WHEREAS, the School Board of the County/City of _____ at its regularly scheduled meeting on _____, 2020, received, reviewed and approved the Agreement;

NOW, THEREFORE, the School Board of _____ directs its Chairman to sign the Agreement and further directs its Chairman and Division Superintendent to take all steps necessary to effectuate the terms of the Agreement, including appointing a representative to serve on the Regional Board.

AGREEMENT TO ESTABLISH AND OPERATE THE Region VII Virtual Academy REGIONAL
SCHOOL

This AGREEMENT is made this ___day of ____, 2020, by and among THE SCHOOL BOARD OF BLAND COUNTY; THE SCHOOL BOARD OF THE CITY OF BRISTOL; THE SCHOOL BOARD OF BUCHANAN COUNTY; THE SCHOOL BOARD OF CARROLL COUNTY; THE SCHOOL BOARD OF DICKENSON COUNTY; THE SCHOOL BOARD OF THE CITY OF GALAX; THE SCHOOL BOARD OF GILES COUNTY; THE SCHOOL BOARD OF GRAYSON COUNTY; THE SCHOOL BOARD OF LEE COUNTY; THE SCHOOL BOARD OF THE CITY OF NORTON; THE SCHOOL BOARD OF NEW PULASKI COUNTY; THE SCHOOL BOARD OF THE CITY OF RADFORD; THE SCHOOL BOARD OF RUSSELL COUNTY; THE SCHOOL BOARD OF SCOTT COUNTY; THE SCHOOL BOARD OF SMYTH COUNTY; THE SCHOOL BOARD OF TAZEWELL COUNTY; THE SCHOOL BOARD OF WASHINGTON COUNTY; THE SCHOOL BOARD OF WISE; AND THE SCHOOL BOARD OF WYTHE COUNTY (hereinafter collectively referred to as the "School Boards").

WHEREAS, the School Boards wish to establish, operate and control a regional school to be known as Region VII Virtual Academy (hereinafter referred to as "Region VII Virtual Academy") pursuant to Virginia Code §22.1-26 and Regulations of the Virginia Board of Education, to provide an option for students in grades Kindergarten through 12 to attend school in a virtual setting either full time, or on a course by course basis, depending on the educational needs of the student, and to provide equipment, materials, and administrative, clerical and teaching staff necessary therefore; and

WHEREAS, the School Boards believe it to be in the best interest of their respective school divisions to make use of the opportunities afforded by an innovative online program, and that this endeavor may be most beneficially accomplished by the operation of a jointly owned and controlled regional school; and

WHEREAS, by entering into this Agreement, the School Boards indicate their intent to participate in Region VII Virtual Academy for a minimum of two years;

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the joint contribution of services and monies toward the operation of Region VII Virtual Academy, the School Boards do hereby agree as follows:

I. BOARD OF CONTROL

A. The Parties agree to operate Region VII Virtual Academy under the control of the Region VII Virtual Academy Board of Control (the "Board") for a minimum of two years, as authorized by Section 22.1-26 of the Code of Virginia and consistent with the regulations of the Board of Education for Jointly Owned and Operated Schools and Jointly Operated Programs, 8VAC20-181-10, *et seq.*

B. The Board shall be composed of one member elected or appointed from each participating school board. Each member of the Board shall serve a two-year term. The Board shall establish the beginning dates of its members. If a member of the Board ceases to be a member of the school board which elected him/her, that person shall cease to be a member of the Board. Each school board shall fill vacancies in its membership on the Board by the election for the unexpired term. The Chair of the Superintendents' Advisory Council will serve as the superintendents' representative to the Board.

C. Members of the Board may receive compensation fixed by each of the member school boards. The compensation shall be paid by the local school boards and shall not exceed the amount paid for the service on the local school boards.

D. The Board shall establish committees as it deems necessary to carry out its responsibilities.

E. The Board shall elect from its membership:

1. A Chair who shall preside at its meetings.
2. A Vice Chair who shall preside in the absence or inability of the Chair to act.

F. The Board shall elect a clerk who shall not be a member of the Board and who shall keep a record of the Board's proceedings. The Board may also appoint a deputy clerk who shall be empowered to act in case of the absence or inability of the clerk to act, or as otherwise provided by resolution of the Board. The Board shall fix the clerk's and any deputy clerk's compensation, along with a bond of at least \$10,000 as required by law.

O. The Board will delegate day-to-day oversight of operations to the Advisory Council made up of the member school divisions' superintendents, and described further in Section III.

H. The Board shall appoint an Executive Director, upon recommendation of the Advisory Council, who shall be employed by the Board and who shall manage the day-to-day operations of Region VII Virtual Academy. The Executive Director shall bring matters to and take direction from the Advisory Council and shall make recommendations to the Advisory Council regarding programs of instruction, staffing needs, operational policies, finances, and all other matters within the purview of the Advisory Council.

I. The powers and duties of the Board shall include, but not be limited to, the following:

1. To adopt such bylaws and policies as are necessary for the efficient operation of Region VII Virtual Academy, provided that such bylaws and policies shall not be inconsistent with the terms of this Agreement.
2. To establish and manage the business and affairs and to provide for the operation of Region VII Virtual Academy.
3. To approve Region VII Virtual Academy's annual budget.
4. To accept and expend as it deems appropriate any funds which may become available for the Board for Region VII Virtual Academy's purposes from any source whatsoever; provided, however, that the Board shall not have the power to obligate the respective School Boards.
5. To make all decisions of policy and, upon recommendation of the Advisory Council, employ such personnel as it deems necessary to carry out the purpose of Region VII Virtual Academy.
6. To contract with the participating School Boards and other entities for such personnel services, equipment, and supplies as it may deem necessary for the efficient operation of Region VII Virtual Academy.
7. To determine, with such professional guidance as it deems necessary or advisable, the curriculum, eligibility standards of the students, and all matters necessary to the efficient operation of Region VII Virtual Academy.
8. To establish all other procedures for the management of the business and affairs and to carry out the purposes of Region VII Virtual Academy, including the employment of legal counsel.
9. To exercise such authority as may be provided under the laws of the Commonwealth of Virginia and the Regulations of the Board of Education.

J. Bylaws

1. The Board shall hold an annual organizational meeting in January of each year for the purpose of electing a Chairman and Vice Chairman and appointing a Clerk. The Board shall affirm the Fiscal Agency for Region VII Virtual Academy during such annual meeting, with the goal of ensuring consistency.
2. The Board shall receive and approve a calendar of regular quarterly meetings at the January organizational meeting.
3. Special meetings of the Board may be called by the Chair of the Board, or by the Superintendents' representative to the Board, provided notice is given in a timely manner to all members of the Board.
4. At least seven days prior to a meeting, other than a special meeting, all Board members shall receive notice of the time and place of such meetings, including a draft agenda and accompanying documents.
5. A majority of the Board shall constitute a quorum at any meeting and a majority of those present shall be necessary for approval of any action item.

II. ADDITIONAL MEMBERS

A. The school boards of other Virginia school divisions may become participants in Region VII Virtual Academy by filing a written application with the clerk of the Board and by sending a copy thereof to the clerk of each of the other participating School Boards. An applicant must receive an affirmative vote of at least three-quarters of the members of the Board present and voting at a regularly scheduled meeting of the Board. Any applicant which becomes a participant must execute an addendum to this Agreement and agree to be bound by the terms hereof and shall be referred to as an Additional Party or Parties.

B. The school board of an applying school division as set forth in paragraph II(A), above, must provide the Board and the Virginia Board of Education a statement of assurance that it intends to participate in Region VII Virtual Academy for a minimum of three years.

C. Any applicant shall also agree that within sixty (60) days after the Board accepts the applicant as an Additional Party, it shall submit an estimate of the number of students to be enrolled in Region VII Virtual Academy during the first year of applicant's membership. The estimate shall be considered the enrollment for purposes of determining the Additional Party's initial contribution to funding Region VII Virtual Academy. At the conclusion of the first year, the Additional Party's financial contribution to Region VII Virtual Academy shall be established as part of the budgeting process by the Board and shall include, in addition to any annual budget contribution from the Additional Party, an initial fee of \$10,000 to participate in Region VII Virtual Academy.

III. SUPERINTENDENTS' ADVISORY COUNCIL

A. The management and administrative authority of Region VII Virtual Academy shall be vested in a Superintendents' Advisory Council (hereinafter referred to as the "Council") composed of the Division Superintendents of the member school divisions, or the Superintendents' duly appointed designees.

B. A majority of the Council shall constitute a quorum at any meeting of the Committee.

C. The Council shall select from its membership a Chair and a Vice-Chair at its annual organizational meeting. The Chair shall preside over all meetings of the Council. The Vice-Chair shall perform the duties and exercise the powers of the Chair during the absence, disability, or request of the Chair.

D. The Council's powers and duties include, but are not limited to, the following:

1. Managing, administering, and operating Region VII Virtual Academy and its programs, including making personnel recommendations.
2. Purchasing supplies, and purchasing, selling, or disposing of equipment.
3. Preparing an annual program plan, budget, and plan for financing of the operation of Region VII Virtual Academy. The financing plan shall include an estimate of the amount of money that will be needed from each member school division during the following academic year for the administration, instruction, and operation of its programs. The Council shall prepare such budget estimates utilizing, as appropriate, the forms furnished by the Board of Education as provided in Section 22.1-92 of the Code of Virginia.
4. Working closely with participating school divisions, governing bodies of the localities, the Virginia Board of Education, and the Virginia Department of Education.

IV. ENROLLMENT

Student enrollment in Region VII Virtual Academy shall be based on referrals from the participating school divisions. Minimum number of slots will be provided to each participating school division as determined by the Board. The Board will identify admissions criteria as well as criteria for the removal of a student from the program. The final decision for all such student actions will rest with the school division of enrollment.

V. FISCAL AGENT

The Radford City Public Schools shall serve as initial Fiscal Agent of Region VII Virtual Academy. The Fiscal Agent shall, in conjunction with the Finance Officer, handle the financial affairs of Region VII Virtual Academy as may be authorized by the Board. Except as they may be modified by or be inconsistent with the policies and regulations adopted by the Board, the policies and regulations of the Fiscal Agent shall be the policies and regulations of Region VII Virtual Academy; provided, however that each participating school board shall be responsible for the discipline of its students attending Region VII Virtual Academy. The Fiscal Agent shall have no direct authority over the administration or operation of Region VII Virtual Academy. A change in the Fiscal Agent shall require approval of the majority of the Board.

1. Monthly and annual financial reports will be presented by the Fiscal Agent to the Advisory Council.
2. A separate accounting will be maintained for Region VII Virtual Academy by the Treasurer of the City of Radford.
3. All revenues and expenditures will be maintained and reported in a separate fund.
4. The audit firm procured by the Radford City School Board shall audit Region VII Virtual Academy's accounts annually and the Board shall pay for such audit from Region VII Virtual Academy's account.
5. All employee benefits, including but not limited to health, dental, and group life insurance, will be arranged through the Fiscal Agent.
6. The Fiscal Agent will process the payroll of the Region VII Virtual Academy personnel on a monthly basis, according to the current process and calendar of that division.

7. The Fiscal Agent will provide all HR services required to recruit, retain, and discipline Region VII Virtual Academy personnel.

VI. FUNDING

A. The School Boards, and any Additional Party or Parties, shall provide an initial payment of \$10,000 to join the Region VII Virtual Academy. This payment is non-refundable should a School Board dissolve its association with the Region VII Virtual Academy.

B. The School Boards, and any Additional Party or Parties, shall provide each fiscal year, on a per pupil basis, such funds as are necessary to establish, operate and maintain Region VII Virtual Academy as determined during the budgeting process undertaken by the Board.

C. The pro rata portion of operating costs shall be determined on the basis of students enrolled by March 1 of the preceding school year.

D. The Advisory Council and the Executive Director shall be responsible for preparing an operating budget for the Board based upon the number of students each School Board proposes to send to Region VII Virtual Academy (the "Student Slots"), net any state, federal, or non-tuition based local funding. The Board shall approve the proposed operating budget not later than March 1st of each year. This budget shall specify the contributions for each participating school board and shall be submitted to each school board in a timely manner and in such detail so that the school board may be fully informed about its required contribution.

E. Each participating school board shall approve its contribution to Region VII Virtual Academy in accordance with the dictates of the budget process within its jurisdiction. A good faith effort shall be made by each participating school board to provide final, approved financial commitment figures as soon after May 15th of each year as is reasonably practical. Approved funds shall be made available by each participating school board upon request of the Board.

F. Once the Board has received the final financial commitments from each participating school board and other funding sources, it shall finalize its annual budget.

G. The Board shall have the right and power to accept and expend as it deems appropriate any funds that may become available to it for educational purposes. However, the Board shall not have the power to obligate the School Boards or any Additional Party or Parties, or their respective appropriating bodies, beyond the funds to be provided to the Board in accordance with this Agreement.

VII. WITHDRAWAL

A. Any participating school board may withdraw from participation in Region VII Virtual Academy by giving written notice to the Clerk of the Board, with a copy to all remaining participating school boards, of its intent to withdraw by February 15th of the year next preceding the fiscal year in which the party intends to withdraw, on the condition that prior to its withdrawal, it shall cause to be conveyed to the remaining titleholders the fractional shares in all interests in property, real or personal, acquired for use of the Board and held by said withdrawing party or on its behalf. Upon and after such withdrawal, no contributions made by the withdrawing Party or on its behalf to or in furtherance of the purposes of Region VII Virtual Academy shall be withdrawn by the Party except as hereinafter provided and the withdrawing Party must, prior to the withdrawal, complete its financial obligation for any funds obligated to Region VII Virtual Academy or in furtherance of the objectives of Region VII Virtual Academy prior to the withdrawal. Upon withdrawal of any Party from this Agreement, pursuant to the terms and conditions of this paragraph, all further obligations and duties of said withdrawing Party under this Agreement shall cease.

B. The withdrawing Party shall prepare and execute such documents as are necessary to relinquish its interest in all property, real and personal, acquired by Region VII Virtual Academy. As soon as practicable after receipt of the notice of withdrawal, all the property of Region VII Virtual Academy in which the withdrawing Party has an interest shall be appraised as of the effective date of withdrawal at the withdrawing Party's expense by a qualified appraiser selected by the Board. Any appraisal of the value of the interest of the Parties shall include the appropriate adjustment for the value of the federal contribution for non-operating expenditures made by each Party and the appreciation thereof. The withdrawing Party shall be paid the appraised value of such property as of the date of its notice of withdrawal in proportion to the withdrawing Party's contribution. Such payment shall be made at the end of the fiscal year in which the withdrawal becomes effective.

C. All expenses incident to the withdrawal shall be borne by the withdrawing Party.

IX. TERMINATION

A. Should the Parties decide to terminate Region VII Virtual Academy, the assets held and owned by the Board after payment of all liabilities will be distributed among the then existing Parties on a pro rata basis, according to the fractional interest owned by each party in the said assets, or on some other basis agreed to by all Parties.

B. All the liabilities and obligations of Region VII Virtual Academy shall be paid, satisfied, and discharged or adequate provision shall be made therefore.

C. Assets held by Region VII Virtual Academy shall be disposed of as permitted by applicable law.

D. All funds that derive from the Commonwealth that remain unexpended after the payment of all liabilities and obligations shall revert to the fund of the Commonwealth from which derived, unless the Board of Education directs otherwise, and all funds derived from the appropriate bodies of the participating localities of the Center at the time of dissolution shall revert to those appropriating bodies on a pro rata basis.

IX. ENTIRE AGREEMENT

This Agreement constitutes the complete understanding among the Parties hereto and it shall not be amended in any respect unless by written agreement approved and executed by each Party hereto. This *Agreement to Establish and Operate the Region VII Virtual Academy Regional Virtual School* can be amended at any regular or special meeting of the Board by an affirmative vote of the majority of the current participating Board members provided that ten (10) days' written notice of any proposed amendment shall be given to all members of the Board.

This "Agreement to Establish and Operate the Region VII Virtual Academy Regional Virtual School" was approved _____, 2020 and signed by division Board members.
