

States with Montessori credential pathways



Connecticut: An AMI diploma + twelve additional credits qualify for a teaching certificate in public Montessori schools only.



Georgia: A MACTE-accredited credential + three special education credits + content area assessment tests and an ethics test qualify for a teaching certificate in public Montessori schools only.



Hawaii: A MACTE-accredited credential + practicum + two elementary method courses from Chaminade University of Honolulu qualify for a PK-3 teaching certificate.



Indiana: A MACTE-accredited credential + a level-specific exam qualifies for a full teaching certificate with no restrictions.



Maryland: A MACTE-accredited, AMI, or AMS credential + a state test qualify for a teaching certificate in public Montessori schools only.



Minnesota: A MACTE-accredited credential + pedagogy and content exams qualify for a three-year renewable certificate.



Montana: A MACTE-accredited Montessori credential qualifies for a full teaching certificate with no restrictions.



Ohio: A MACTE, AMI, or AMS credential qualifies for a four-year provisional certificate, during which time additional requirements must be met.



South Carolina: A MACTE-accredited credential + the PRAXIS exam qualify for a teaching certificate in public Montessori schools only.



Wisconsin: A MACTE or AMI credential + 3 additional courses + EdTPA/PRAXIS qualify for a teaching certificate in public Montessori schools only.
