Mission

 To work collaboratively with regional education, healthcare, and community partners to provide a rigorous, high-quality learning environment that promotes increased awareness of potential healthcare careers and prepares college and career ready students to pursue the required college degrees and professional credential that lead to healthcare careers.

Vision

To establish an academic pipeline for preparing future healthcare professionals to meet the healthcare workforce needs in Southwest Virginia.

SWVA-HEALS Goals & Objective

- Increase the number of high school graduates from Southwest Virginia who become healthcare providers practicing in Southwest Virginia.
 - Develop a sustainable academic pipeline for preparing future healthcare professionals to meet the workforce shortages in Southwest Virginia
