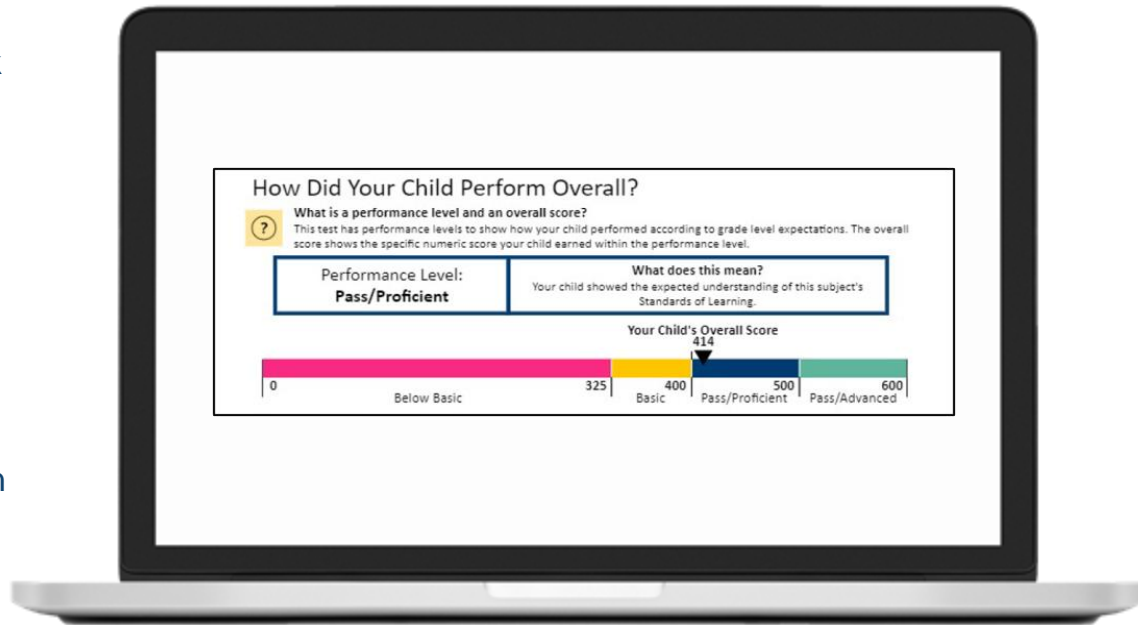
1. Spring 2024 SOL Report
